The International Ph.D. Program in Indigenous Studies at the College of Indigenous Studies is recruiting for a position (teaching & research) in Taiwan, Austronesia, and Global Indigenous Studies at either Assistant professor, Associate professor, or Professor level. The position will be effective on August 1, 2024.

We invite applications from established and early career colleagues. The role includes (but is not limited to) initiating and developing course materials, coordinating courses, and teaching Ph.D. subjects in Indigenous People in Taiwan, Austronesia people and cultures, Indigenous Rights in International Law, International Relations and Politics of Indigenous People across the Globe, and other related topics.

The successful candidate will contribute to Ph.D. teaching and supervision, further program development, and perform administrative and other activities associated with the university.

Eligibility

- Ph.D. in indigenous studies or related fields.
- Experience in using English as a medium of instruction.
- Practical experience in working with indigenous communities.

How to Apply?

All applicants must supply the following documents in order for your application to be considered:

- A curriculum vitae (including academic specialty description, autobiography, a list of courses that can be taught in English, and a list of publications).
- Educational experience certificate (including dissertation)

Suppose you earned your Ph.D. outside Taiwan. You need to prepare the following:

- (1) The certification of foreign degree verified by the Embassies and Missions abroad, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Taiwan, R.O.C.

(2) The certificate of entry and exit dates during your study if you are a Taiwanese.

- Publications within the past five years.
- Three letters of recommendation. (The recommendation letters can be sent directly by E-mail from the three references.)
- The transcripts of undergraduate and graduate programs.
- Applicants who have teaching experience, please submit the course syllabus and evaluations within the past five years for evidence of teaching effectiveness.
- If you have the certificate of Assistant Professor (including the above), please provide a copy of the certificate.
- Other related documentation.

About the Selection Process

As part of the selection process, applicants shortlisted for interviews must demonstrate their English teaching skills to program committee members. The lecture topics will be provided with adequate notice to prospective candidates.
