Japanese Summer Program

This summer, experience Japan!



Tokyo Metropolitan University (TMU) offers a 3-week Japanese program this summer. It aims at providing a comprehensive introduction to students about the Japanese language and culture.

Students will develop their language skills, experience traditional and current cultural Japanese customs and better their understanding of Japanese society through field studies and Japanese home visit experience.

This program provides international students an opportunity to gain essential workplace skills through practical career workshops.



Program Contents

The 3-week program consists of the hands-on experiences such as field trip, career workshop and home visit, as well as lectures, Japanese language learning and Japan studies. Students will be evaluated based on their class participation through a verbal presentation and quizzes. A certificate will be issued upon completion of the program.

■ Japanese Language (40.5H)

Three levels of Japanese language classes are set for students who have just begun learning Japanese or want to accelerate their learning process.

Field Trip (6H)

A variety of issues concerning traditional and contemporary Tokyo and Japan will be studied outside the classroom. Kabuki show in Ginza and kimono experience in Asakusa are planned.

■ Home Visit (6H) + Japan Studies 1 (1.5H)

Spending time with a Japanese familiy having lunch or tea. After learning about Japanese customs in lectures, students visit a Japanese home and experience real life in Japan.

■ Career Workshops (3H)+ Japan Studies 2,3 (3H)

The Career workshops are designed to deliver information to international students for their understanding of the recruitment process. Lectures will be held in mainly English and partly in Japanese, and students will need to discuss or give presentations in English.

Program Length

Tuesday, June 9 – Friday, June 26, 2020

Program Fee

120,000 JPY (incl. accommodation)

Tuition fee is waived according to the exchange agreement. The program fee does not include meals, airfare, travel insurance, transportation from university to accommodation, and daily expenses. Program fees should be paid by overseas remittance no later than March 25, 2020. Details regarding the payment method will be sent after the application is accepted.

Eligible Participants

All undergraduate or graduate students from our partner universities who can attend the program full-time are eligible.

Cancellation Policy

Please be advised that once the application has been accepted and the fees have been paid, the following cancellation policy will apply:

A maximum of 50% of the program fee will be forfeited in case of cancellation on or before May 8.

A maximum of 100% of the program fee will be forfeited in case of cancellation on or after May

Notes

- Admission could be competitive. Due to the limited capacity of the program, only selected applications will be accepted.
- ♦ The program schedule may be subject to change.
- Participants are required to purchase their own travel insurance to cover medical costs incurred during their stay and must submit a copy of the insurance certificate before arrival.
